Establishes penalties for reckless endangerment committed by discharging a firearm into a group of two or more people from a vehicle, or into a vehicle as a fine between \$5,000 and \$10,000 and a five-year revocation of a driver's license following release. Permits petition for a restricted driver's license for people whose license has been revoked under these terms. Clarifies that each person endangered by a reckless endangerment violation constitutes as a separate offense. Requires defendants convicted of reckless endangerment with a deadly weapon to attend anger management class. Establishes the crime of community terrorism as a gang-related offense committed against a population by members of a criminal gang and enhances punishment for crimes falling under this designation.



The court of appeals has held that there does not need to be a connection between the self-defense events and the illegal action such that a zoning violation, a failure to have vehicle insurance, etc., would deprive the person of the self-defense presumption. This bill alters that slightly by eliminating the "any" clause to exclude Class C and Class B misdemeanors. TFA requests that the bill be amended to simply delete the reference to "any unlawful activity" and not substitute another qualifier. The self-defense laws, as written and without that clause, would be entirely adequate.
