1. **HB1975 EDUCATION:** Automatic revocation of the license of a licensed teacher or administrator. Adds offenses to the list of offenses for which, upon conviction, the state board of education shall Moody D. automatically revoke a teacher's or administrator's license, including arson or aggravated arson, proving a handgun to juveniles, and child abuse, child neglect or child endangerment.

1. **HB1713 CRIMINAL LAW: Limitations on leaving handguns in unattended motor vehicles or boats.** Prohibits a person from leaving a handgun in a motor vehicle or boat that is unattended or Hardaway contains only persons under the age of eighteen, if the firearm is not kept from ordinary observation and is not secured. First violation is punishable by civil penalty of fifty dollars, and second G. violation is punishable by a civil penalty of one hundred dollars. Authorizes the court to require the person to take a handgun safety course that is approved by the department of safety and to waive the civil penalty.

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13. HB1478 CRIMINAL LAW: Reckless endangerment. Revises definition of reckless endangerment to include use of a motor vehicle to harass, injure, or obstruct another person. Establishes penalties

Hardaway for reckless endangerment committed by discharging a firearm into a group of two or more people from a vehicle, or into a vehicle as a fine between \$5,000 and \$10,000 and a five-year G. revocation of a driver's license following release. Permits petition for a restricted driver's license for people whose license has been revoked under these terms. Clarifies that each person endangered by a reckless endangerment violation constitutes as a separate offense. Requires defendants convicted of reckless endangerment with a deadly weapon to attend anger management class. Establishes the crime of community terrorism as a gang-related offense committed against a population by members of a criminal gang and enhances punishment for crime falling under this designation.
