21. **HB2108** White M.

CRIMINAL LAW: Allows law enforcement officers to carry handguns in posted areas. Allows law enforcement officers to carry handguns in posted areas under certain circumstances even when the owner or entity prohibits and restricts the possession of weapons. Broadly captioned.

<u>Amendment Summary:</u> House Judiciary Committee amendment 1 (013800) deletes and replaces all language after the enacting clause. Clarifies that law enforcement officers are exempt from laws allowing individuals, corporations, businesses entities, or local, state, or federal government entities or agents to prohibit firearms on property they own, operate, or manage.

**Comment:** The bill's inclusion of those carrying pursuant to TCA 39-17-1350 continues the policy concept of creating different classes of civilians who are "off duty" based on their status or employment. Any legislation which differentiates between classes of citizens in the self-defense issue based on what the person did prior to retirement, whether the person served any government role, or whether the person when "on duty" is in some category of law enforcement is a law which denies other citizens the equal right under the law to protect their lives in those same locations. NOTICE -- the House amendment would allow off duty officers to ignore signs on private property which prohibit guns.

25. **HB2590** Littleton M

CRIMINAL LAW: Allows elected officials and county attorneys to carry handguns in buildings with judicial proceedings. Allows an elected official of any county or municipality or county attorney with a valid handgun carry permit, in the actual discharge of official duties, to carry inside a building in which judicial proceedings are in progress, but not in the room in which judicial proceedings are in progress. Broadly captioned.

TFA opposes this legislation on that basis and instead urges the sponsors to repeal the provisions of state law which prohibit citizens, any citizens, from carrying in any public building (TFA would not oppose a restriction on carrying in a room in which court proceedings are currently in progress IF the law required the government to provide secure storage for firearms for those involved in the court proceedings)

32. **HB2259** Lamberth W.

CRIMINAL LAW: Requires monthly reporting of certain juvenile justice information to the administrative office of the courts. Includes a probation violation as part of a delinquent case that resulted in a child being placed on probation. Requires each juvenile court clerk report to the administrative office of the courts each new delinquent case a child is charged including information concerning the child's, case, and information pertaining to services received under the Juvenile Justice Reform Act of 2018. Requires information collected by the administrative office of the courts be kept confidential. Part of Administration Package. Broadly captioned.

Updates definitions for out of home placement, probation, and re-offense. Hensley J. CRIMINAL LAW: Sets punishments for second amendment infringement. Allows individuals whose second amendment rights have been infringed upon to enact civil action. Requires persons or government entities violating an individual's second amendment right be liable for actual damages, statutory damages of \$500 per day of violation, punitive damages, or reasonable attorney's fees. Declares a government official who knowingly infringes upon an individual's second amendment rights can be removed from their position.

# 17. **SB2527**

Stevens J. **CRIMINAL LAW: Use of justifiable force in civil action cases.** Protects defendants using or threatening to use force against any civil actions based on use of justifiable force unless the plaintiff is a law enforcement officer. Requires criminal investigations halt any civil actions against the defendant until the investigation concludes. Requires immunity hearings for civil actions made against a defendant be expedited and requires the court issue a decision withing 40 days of the hearing. Broadly captioned.

Specifies that theft of a firearm worth less than \$2,500 is a Class E felony offense. Enhances the mandatory confinement period for theft of a firearm to 180 days. Creates an enhancement factor when an offense involved the theft of a firearm from a motor vehicle. Requires no release eligibility for certain offenses committed after July 1, 2020 unless 85 percent of an imposed sentence is served, less sentence credits. Prohibits a reduction of such sentences less than 70 percent of the sentence imposed.
