**ENVIRONMENT & NATURE: Protection of Private Property and Sporting Rights Act** Prohibits a wildlife resources officer from entering any privately owned property unless the officer has a valid search warrant, has written permission of the landowner or the lessee of the property, has observed an illegal act, is there to dispatch crippled or distressed wildlife, or is responding to a report of an emergency or another overt threat to public safety.

<u>Amendment Summary:</u> Senate amendment 1, House Constitutional Protections & Sentencing Subcommittee amendment 1 (015496) deletes all language after the enacting clause. Requires that full-time wildlife resource officers charged with enforcing wildlife laws must have a search warrant to inspect the interior of an automobile.

Changes from February 1 to January 15 the date by which the TBI is required to provide an annual report to the judiciary committees of the senate and house of representatives regarding the amount of money collected from gun dealers to perform background checks in excess of the TBI cost of background checks. Broadly captioned.
