HB2027

CRIMINAL LAW: Extends validity of enhanced handgun permits. Extends the validity of enhanced handgun carry permits issued on or after January 1, Lamberth 2021 for the duration of the permit holder's life. Requires the department of safety to run a name based criminal history check every five years to determine if the permit holder continues to meet requirements and if not, the department must revoke or suspend the permit. Creates other requirements regarding the suspension of a permit.

Amendment Summary: House Judiciary Committee amendment 1 (014980) deletes and replaces all language after the enacting clause. Increases the number of name-based criminal history background checks run on handgun permit holders from every five years to every four years. Broadens the ability of a permit holder to prove a delivered renewal permit application by deleting the requirement that the permit holder provide a receipt of the renewal application

It should also be amended to make clear that a TN handgun permit does not expire or terminate if the person moves out of state.

CRIMINAL LAW: Reporting issuing and denying judges' decisions. Increases amount of time an issuing or denying judge is required to report to the Lamberth attorney general and reporter the denial or an order approving an interception from 30 to 45 days after the expiration or extension of the order. Broadly captioned.

Amendment Summary: Senate Judiciary Committee amendment 1, House Judiciary Committee amendment 1 (015802) creates exceptions for the offense of open or concealed carrying of a firearm with the intent to go armed for any person legally in possession and not prohibited from carrying a firearm. Specifies that theft of a firearm worth less than \$2,500 is a Class E felony offense. Enhances the mandatory confinement period for theft of a firearm to 180 days. Creates an enhancement factor when an offense involved the theft of a firearm from a motor vehicle. Requires no release eligibility for certain offenses committed after July 1, 2020 unless 85 percent of an imposed sentence is served, less sentence credits. Prohibits a reduction of such sentences less than 70 percent of the sentence imposed.

Comment: This is the "Governor's" bill. This bill creates an exception for only those individuals who would be eligible to be issued an enhanced handgun permit (but who have not done so) to carry in very limited locations without a permit. It would not apply to all individuals who can legally purchase a firearm in Tennessee. It would not apply to citizens from other states.

CRIMINAL LAW: Offense of aggravated assault involving the use of a deadly weapon. Requires that a person convicted of the offense of aggravated assault involving the use of a deadly weapon to be punished one classification higher than otherwise provided if the violation was committed by discharging a firearm from within a motor vehicle.

48 HB1478

CRIMINAL LAW: Reckless endangerment. Revises definition of reckless endangerment to include use of a motor vehicle to harass, injure, or obstruct Hardaway another person. Establishes penalties for reckless endangerment committed by discharging a firearm into a group of two or more people from a vehicle, or into a vehicle as a fine between \$5,000 and \$10,000 and a five-year revocation of a driver's license following release. Permits petition for a restricted driver's license for people whose license has been revoked under these terms. Clarifies that each person endangered by a reckless endangerment violation constitutes as a separate offense. Requires defendants convicted of reckless endangerment with a deadly weapon to attend anger management class. Establishes the crime of community terrorism as a gang-related offense committed against a population by members of a criminal gang and enhances punishment for crimes falling under this designation.

Amendment Summary: House Judiciary Committee amendment 1 (014391), which deletes and rewrites the bill such that the substantive changes are to: (1) remove mandatory fines associated with certain reckless endangerment offenses; (2) revise the process for issuance of a driver license for individuals convicted of such offenses; (3) specify that the offense of reckless endangerment may be committed individually or in concert with another person; and (4) change the effective date to July 1, 2020.

57. **HB135** Love Jr. CRIMINAL LAW: Offense of reckless endangerment by discharging a firearm into a parade or religious service. Creates a Class C felony offense of reckless endangerment when someone discharges a firearm into a parade, religious service, concert, athletic event, political event, educational event, or into any other group of 25 or more people who are lawfully assembled.

Amendment Summary: Senate Judiciary Committee amendment 1, House Judiciary Committee amendment 1 (004918) declares exemption to the crime of reckless endangerment by discharging a firearm if done by a member of a law enforcement agency or any branch of the military acting in the course of a person's official duties, involves the firing of non-live ammunition as part of a funeral, or occurs in a location where participants have assumed the risk of the activity involving the discharge of a firearm, including group hunting activities.
