- 2. HB477 CRIMINAL LAW: Off duty law enforcement officers carrying firearms into certain locations Clarifies that a law enforcement officer is not prohibited from carrying a firearm into certain
 - White locations regardless of whether the officer is on or off duty. Clarifies that the exemption to the ban on weapons in parks and other similar places for a law enforcement officer applies regardless of whether the officer is on duty. Requires signage in such places to state, "All law enforcement officers are exempt."

TFA would prefer to see this bill amended to make clear that those citizens who have the "enhanced permits" are at a minimum given the same scope to carry that other citizens - who happen to be law enforcement officers when "on the job" - have.
