10. SB160 CAMPAIGNS & LOBBYING: Political action committees. Broadens the term "political action



Briggs committee" to include "political campaign committees" and "multicandidate political campaign committees," which include clubs, corporations, associations or others groups that receive contributions and make expenditures, which, in the aggregate exceed \$2000, to support of oppose two or more candidates in a calendar year. Outlines expenditure reporting requirements for political action committees and updates candidate obligations regarding contributions and reporting. Provides that all sworn complaints on a report of a candidate for state public office, a political action committee contributing to such a candidate, or a political action committee registered with the registry of election finance must be filed in that office. Directs that office to conduct a preliminary review to determine if further action is warranted. Outlines requirements of a district attorney investigating sworn complaints. Changes from July 1 to January 15 the date by which the registry must provide an annual report to the govern and the general assembly.

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5. HJR38 CRIMINAL LAW: Constitutional amendment - citizen's right to bear arms. Proposes an Reedy amendment to Article I, Section 26 of the Constitution of Tennessee to remove the provision that
