SB7002/HB7016 **CRIMINAL LAW: Creates the criminal offense of threatening to commit an act of mass violence.**

**Summary:** Creates a Class E felony offense of recklessly, by any means of communication, threatening to commit an act of mass violence. Specifies that if the the offense involves a threat to commit an act of mass violence on the property of a school, house of worship, or a federal, state, or local government then a violation is a Class D felony. Requires the court to determine whether a defendant charged with threatening to commit an act of mass violence is a threat to the public prior to release on bail.

TENNESSEE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FISCAL REVIEW COMMITTEE FISCAL NOTE SB 7002 - HB 7016 August 21, 2023SUMMARY OF BILL: Creates a Class E felony offense for recklessly, by any means ofcommunication, threatening to commit an act of mass violence and the threat causes areasonable expectation or reasonable fear of the imminent commission of an act of massviolence.The classification is enhanced to a Class D felony if: (1) the violation involves threatening tocommit an act of mass violence on the property of a school, a house of worship, or a federal,state, or local government, at a live performance, or at a place that is open to the public andaverages 250 or more visitors per day; (2) the defendant has one or more prior convictions forsuch offense or a Class A misdemeanor threat of mass violence on a school property underTenn. Code Ann. 39-16-517; or (3) the defendant has taken a substantial step towards carryingout an act of mass violence.Requires, as a condition of bail or other pretrial release, a court to order a defendant chargedwith threatening to commit an act of mass violence to undergo a mental health evaluation todetermine whether the defendant poses a substantial likelihood of serious harm to the person orothers. Requires the Department of Safety (DOS) to create a behavioral risk assessment, whichmay be used by the court in determining whether the defendant is a threat to the public.Authorizes a sentencing court to order a person convicted of threatening to commit an act ofmass violence to pay restitution, including costs and damages resulting from the disruption ofthe normal activity that would have otherwise occurred but for the threat to commit an act ofmass violence.Prohibits a defendant charged with threatening an act of mass violence from being released onbail unless authorized by a judge.Effective January 1, 2024.FISCAL IMPACT: Increase State Expenditures \$2,766,900 Incarceration \$508,300/FY23-24/General Fund \$1,016,600/FY24-25 and Subsequent Years/General Fund Decrease Local Expenditures \$3,400/FY23-24 \$6,800/FY24-25 and Subsequent Years SB 7002 - HB 7016

**SB7003 CRIMINAL LAW: Civil liability for damages, injuries, or death resulting from theft of a firearm properly stored in motor vehicle.**

Requires the department to submit a report to the speaker of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives, on or before December 31, 2024, on whether additional inpatient psychiatric services are needed in the City of Knoxville. Specifies that such report must include recommendations on whether additional state funds should be expended for the construction of a state-owned and -operated inpatient psychiatric facility in the City of Knoxville.

TENNESSEE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FISCAL REVIEW COMMITTEE FISCAL NOTE SB 7006 - HB 7028 August 21, 2023 SUMMARY OF BILL: Requires the clerk of court who maintains records of the adjudication as a mental defective or judicial commitment to a mental institution to send notice of the adjudication or commitment to the clerk of court in the county of the person's permanent residence no later than five business days after the date adjudication as a mental defective is made or judicial commitment is ordered. Specifies that an inpatient treatment facility or hospital must report a service recipient who is involuntarily committed to the facility or hospital to the municipal police or county sheriff where (1) the service recipient permanently resides, if the service recipient is a resident of this state; or (2) the inpatient treatment facility is located, if the service recipient is not a resident of this state. TENNESSEE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FISCAL REVIEW COMMITTEE FISCAL NOTE HB 7058 - SB 7008 August 21, 2023 SUMMARY OF BILL: Requires licensed physicians, certified nurse practitioners, and licensed physician assistants who determine that a service recipient has communicated an actual threat of bodily harm against a victim to take reasonable care to predict, warn of, or take precautions to protect the identified victim from the service recipient's violent behavior, if it is determined that the service recipient has the apparent ability to commit such an act and is likely to carry out the threat unless prevented from doing so. Requires licensed physicians, certified nurse practitioners, and licensed physician assistants to report such a threat of serious bodily harm or death to local law enforcement. TENNESSEE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FISCAL REVIEW COMMITTEE FISCAL NOTE HB 7099 August 21, 2023SUMMARY OF BILL: Authorizes law enforcement officers and agencies to file petitions for risk protection orders within the county where a respondent resides or the petitioner's law enforcement office is located. Establishes requirements that each petition and petitioner must meet and prohibits filing or processing fees. Establishes timeframes under which the court must order a hearing and requires the respondent to undergo a mental health assessment by a certified evaluator. Limits a temporary mental health order of protection for a period of up to 180 days. Establishes procedures and requirements for a respondent to submit a request to vacate the risk protection order. Courts shall notify the petitioner at least 30 days prior to the date the risk protection order ends. The petitioner may request an extension of the risk protection order. Authorizes the court to extend the order for up to an additional 180-day period. Upon the issuance of a risk protection order, a respondent must surrender all firearms and ammunition owned by or in the possession of the respondent and the respondent's handgun carry permit to local law enforcement. After the risk protection order is vacated or ends without extension, law enforcement agencies must verify through a background check that the respondent is currently eligible to own or possess firearms and ammunition and the DOS must reinstate any suspended handgun carry permits. Establishes a process for a respondent to transfer all firearms and ammunition to another person who meets certain requirements. Requires the court clerk to enter any risk protection order into the uniform case reporting system within 24 hours after issuance and requires the petitioning law enforcement agency to enter the order into the national crime information center and similar state database. Creates a Class E felony offense for a person who violates a risk protection order by having custody or control, or purchasing, possessing, or receiving a firearm or any ammunition. Requires the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) to develop and prepare standardized petitions and forms, as well as a court staff handbook on the risk protection order process to be used after January 1, 2024.
