SB7001/HB7002 EDUCATION: Fire alarm activated at school due to presence of active shooter.

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Sen. Haile, Ferrell Rep. Lamberth, William

Summary:

Requires each LEA, public charter school, private school, and church-related school to develop a policy to direct how students, teachers, substitute teachers, and staff are to respond when a fire alarm is activated on school premises outside of a scheduled fire drill to protect students, teachers, substitute teachers, and staff in the event the fire alarm was activated due to the presence of an active shooter on school premises.

SB7002/HB7016 CRIMINAL LAW: Creates the criminal offense of threatening to commit an act of mass violence.

Sen. Haile, Ferrell Rep. Cochran, Mark

Summary: Creates a Class E felony offense of recklessly, by any means of communication, threatening to commit an act of mass violence. Specifies that

if the the offense involves a threat to commit an act of mass violence on the property of a school, house of worship, or a federal, state, or local government then a violation is a Class D felony. Requires the court to determine whether a defendant charged with threatening to commit an

act of mass violence is a threat to the public prior to release on bail.

SB7005/HB7006 MENTAL HEALTH: Inpatient psychiatric services for uninsured individuals.

Summary:

Requires the department of mental health and substance abuse services to direct available state funds to contract with additional private service providers across the state to provide inpatient psychiatric services for uninsured individuals in this state. Requires the department to submit a report to the speaker of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives, on or before December 31, 2024, on whether additional inpatient psychiatric services are needed in the City of Knoxville. Specifies that such report must include recommendations on whether additional state funds should be expended for the construction of a state-owned and -operated inpatient psychiatric facility in the City of Knoxville.

Requires every state healthcare entity to do the following: (1) Provide such coverage for children, adolescents, and adults; (2) Apply the definitions of generally accepted standards of mental health or substance use disorder care, medically necessary, and mental health or substance use disorder in making any medical necessity, prior authorization, or utilization review determinations under such coverage; (3) Ensure that any subcontractor or affiliate responsible for management of mental health and substance use disorder care on behalf of the state healthcare entity complies with this bill; (4) Process hospital claims for emergency healthcare services for mental health or substance use disorders in accordance with this section regardless of whether a member is treated in an emergency department; and (5) No later than January 1, 2024, and annually thereafter, submit a report to the commissioner of commerce and insurance that contains the comparative analysis and other information required of insurers under the federal Mental Health Parity and Addiction Equity Act of 2008 and which delineates the comparative analysis and written processes and strategies used to apply benefits for children, adolescents, and adults. No later than January 1, 2025, and annually thereafter, this bill requires the commissioner to publish on the department's website in a prominent location the reports submitted to the commissioner.
