Summary:	Rep. Cepicky, Scott Requires the department of mental health and substance abuse services to direct available state funds to contract with additional private service providers across the state to provide inpatient psychiatric services for uninsured individuals in this state. Requires the department to submit a report to the speaker of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives, on or before December 31, 2024, on whether additional inpatient psychiatric services are needed in the City of Knoxville. Specifies that such report must include recommendations on whether additional state funds should be expended for the construction of a state-owned and -operated inpatient psychiatric facility in the City of Knoxville.
