SB7085/HB7012 CRIMINAL LAW: Department of safety to provide free firearm locks to Tennessee residents upon request.

Summary:	Requires the department of safety to provide free firearm locks to a Tennessee resident upon the resident's request. Requires the department
	to prominently display on the department's website instructions for requesting free firearm locks. Requires the department to collaborate with
	the TBI, and other state agencies to create a public safety campaign dedicated to safe firearm storage. Exempts the retail sale of firearm safes
	and firearm safety devices from sales and use taxes beginning November 1, 2023. Defines firearm safes and firearm safety devices.

Summary:	Changes from 30 days to 72 hours the time frame within which a clerk of the circuit or general sessions court must notify the TBI of the final disposition of criminal proceedings against a person after final disposition of such proceedings. Requires the clerk to notify the TBI of the final disposition of such proceedings by electronic submission. Requires the clerk of the municipal court, when exercising concurrent general sessions court jurisdiction, to notify the TBI by electronic submission of the final disposition of such proceedings against a person as soon as practicable but no later than 72 hours after final disposition of such proceedings.
